To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives

On October 1, 1985, the President's twelfth special message for fiscal year 1985 and the first special message for fiscal year 1986 were submitted to the Congress pursuant to the Impoundment Control Act of 1974. The special messages propose two new deferrals and two revised deferrals totalling \$1,443,987,523 for fiscal year 1985 and twenty-three new deferrals totalling \$1,628,765,311 for fiscal year 1986. Our report follows:

## FISCAL YEAR 1985

FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT

D85-2C International Security Assistance Economic Support Fund Amount deferred: \$1,428,000,000 115/61037 115/71037

Deferral D85-2C increased the amount previously reported as deferred in this account (deferral D85-2B of the President's fourth special message for fiscal year 1985, January 4, 1985), from \$4,179,732,508 to \$5,607,732,508. In connection with deferral D85-2C, the President reported that \$4,247,341,000 has been released for obligation. Recent apportionment schedules, dated September 18, 1985, confirm that, as reported in this message, an additional \$253,141,000 has been released. Thus, the amount deferred at the end of fiscal year 1985 was \$1,107,250,508.

Deferral D85-76 expired at the end of fiscal year 1985. These funds have been released for obligation.

D85-8B Office of Assistant Secretary for Health Scientific Activities Overseas (special foreign currency program) Amount deferred: \$5,548,866 75X1102

This deferral expired at the end of fiscal year 1985. The President, on October 1, 1985, in his first special message for fiscal year 1986, reported a deferral of \$3,000,000 of these funds in deferral D86-16, listed below. The remaining \$2,548,866 has been released for obligation in fiscal year 1986.

Deferral D85-77 expired at the end of fiscal year 1985. Deferral of these funds has been renewed in fiscal year 1986 by deferral D86-20, listed below, reported by the President on October 1, 1985.

## FISCAL YEAR 1986

FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT

D86-1 Appalachian Regional Development Programs Amount deferred: \$10,000,000 11X0090

In deferral D86-1, the President explains that his fiscal year 1986 Budget proposes that the Appalachian Regional Commission be terminated. These funds are being deferred to pay termination costs. Although this deferral is reported for the entire fiscal year, the Office of Management and Budget has informally indicated to us that if the Congress does not terminate the Commission, these funds will be released for obligation.

The Office of Management and Budget's cumulative report on impoundments, dated October 9, 1985, indicates that \$5,298,000 of the amount reported as deferred has been released for obligation. Accordingly, the amount deferred is \$347,781,040, rather than \$353,079,040.

In deferrals D86-6, D86-7, and D86-8, the President explains that these funds are being deferred through fiscal year 1986 or until the Congress enacts a fiscal year 1986 appropriation using these funds to offset fiscal year 1986 requirements. The Office of Management and Budget has informally indicated to us that if the Congress should reject the proposed offsets, the funds would remain deferred because they cannot be effectively used in this fiscal year.

According to the most recent apportionment schedule, dated September 30, 1985, total budgetary resources for this account are \$26,564,000, rather than the reported amount of The difference, \$25,100,000, represents funds \$1,464,000. obtained by the Department of Energy under its borrowing authority in section 19(n)(4) of the Federal Nonnuclear Energy Research and Development Act, 42 U.S.C. § 5919(n)(4). The Secretary of Energy, as guarantor of a loan obtained by the Great Plains Gasification Associates, had borrowed funds from the Treasury with which he paid the amount due on the loan when the Great Plains Gasification Associates defaulted in August 1985. The most recent borrowing of \$25,100,000, according to Department of Energy officials, will be used to pay interest the Department now owes the Treasury on the earlier borrowing.

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D86-12 Power Marketing Administration Southeastern Power Administration, Operation and Maintenance Amount deferred: \$25,344,000 89x0302

The Office of Management and Budget's cumulative report on impoundments dated October 9, 1985, indicates that \$536,000 of this amount has been released for obligation. Accordingly, the amount deferred is now \$24,808,000, rather than the reported amount of \$25,344,000.

According to officials of the Department of State, the actual unobligated balance of this account, which was brought forward on October 1, 1985, was \$18,095,689; the Department had initially estimated this amount at \$18,082,000. Therefore, the total budgetary resources available are \$18,095,869, rather than \$18,082,000 as reported in deferral D86-19. The difference, \$13,869, remains available for obligation.
