A contractor's complaint against the cancellation of its contracts constitutes a dispute under the contract disputes procedures and is not a matter for review under GAO's Bid Protest Procedures.

United Industries (United) protests the action taken by Hill Air Force Base (Air Force) in canceling all of United's contracts.

We dismiss the protest.

Under our Bid Protest Procedures, 4 C.F.R. part 21 (1984), we consider whether an award, or proposed award, of a contract complies with statutory, regulatory, and other legal requirements. Empire Electric Company, Inc., B-213621.2, Jan. 12, 1984, 84-1 C.P.D. ¶ 68. Cancellation of existing contracts constitutes a dispute relating to a contract for resolution under the contract disputes procedures pursuant to the Contracts Disputes Act of 1978, 41 U.S.C. § 601 (1982). Panasonic Industrial Company, B-213693, Nov. 30, 1983, 83-2 C.P.D. ¶ 641.
