MATTER OF: B&B Boat Building, Inc.--Reconsideration

DIGEST:

Request for reconsideration filed more than 6 weeks after decision is issued is untimely.

B&B Boat Building, Inc. requests reconsideration of our decision in B&B Boat Building, Inc., B-220852, Oct. 28, 1985, 85-2 CPD ¶ 478, in which we dismissed B&B's protest of the rejection of its bid under invitation for bids No. 5-SI-30-03770 issued by the Bureau of Reclamation, Department of the Interior.

The request for reconsideration is untimely.

Our Bid Protest Regulations provide that a request for reconsideration must be received by the Office not later than 10 working days after the basis for reconsideration is known or should have been known. 4 C.F.R. § 21.12(b) (1985). Since the basis of B&B's request is its disagreement with our decision, the request should have been filed within 10 working days of its receipt of our decision. Lucco Art Studio, Inc.--Reconsideration, B-218415.2, Apr. 12, 1985, 85-1 CPD ¶ 425. Our initial decision was issued on October 28, and we received B&B's request for reconsideration on December 13. Since more than 6 weeks elapsed between issuance of our decision and the filing of the request for reconsideration, the request is untimely. Novak Co., Inc.,--Reconsideration, B-217023.2, Jan. 25, 1985, 85-1 CPD ¶ 101.

We dismiss the request for reconsideration.
