Subject: National Service Programs: Enrollment and Education Award Data on Selected AmeriCorps Projects

Last month, we issued a report on AmeriCorps state commissions as mandated by the Omnibus Consolidated Rescissions and Appropriations Act of 1996 (P.L. 104-134).¹ The report provided information on (1) the statutory role of state commissions; (2) state commission operations, including project level outputs from 24 national service projects within their purview, such as participant enrollment, attrition, and education award usage; and (3) extending state commissions' administrative and oversight role over AmeriCorps and correspondingly decreasing the federal government's role. In summary, we found that

- the national service statute emphasized state control over AmeriCorps,
- commission budgets and staffing, and project outputs varied considerably, and
- state and federal officials agreed on the need for a federal role, but differed on the degree of state control.

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This correspondence responds to your request for supplemental information on the report on AmeriCorps' state commissions. Specifically, you asked us, for the aforementioned 24 AmeriCorps projects, to (1) distinguish between full- and part-time participants for enrollment, attrition, and education award usage counts, expressing enrollment and attrition figures in full-time equivalency; (2) determine the number of participants whose education award eligibility is pending review or service completion; and (3) distinguish between the number of participants who earned a full or pro-rated share of an education award. This information is provided in the two enclosures and pertains to the 1994-95 program year.

Enclosure 1 presents the enrollment and attrition data on a full-time, part-time, and full-time equivalent basis. Enclosure 2 shows the following data:

- **Total awards earned:** education awards earned by full- and part-time participants.²
- **Full awards:** education awards earned by full- and part-time participants who received the maximum value of an award for completing their entire terms of service.
- **Pro-rated awards:** education awards earned by full- and part-time participants who did not complete an entire term of service because of compelling personal circumstances and received a reduced award amount based on service time completed.³
- **Ineligible for award:** participants who (1) did not complete their terms of service and failed to earn an education award or who (2) completed their service and opted to receive a non-federally subsidized cash award instead of an education award.
- **Awards pending:** education awards assigned to (1) participants who are still working toward completing their terms of service or (2) participants for whom

²Participants can earn an education award up to \$4,725 for full-time service or half that amount for part-time service. A minimum of 1,700 hours of service within a year is required to earn the full award. To earn a part-time award, a participant must perform 900 hours of community service within 2 years (or within 3 years in the case of full-time college students).

³Participants can earn pro-rated education awards when they are released from service for compelling personal circumstances, such as illness or critical family matters, and have served at least 15 percent of their service term.


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the Corporation for National and Community Service has not received certification of service completion.

- Awards accessed: education awards used by participants to make payments to qualified postsecondary institutions or student loan lenders.⁴
